Reading from Scripture

Use **one** of the readings of the day: www.usccb.org/nab/.

If the first reading:

A reading from the book of [name].

(response: Thanks be to God)

If the Gospel:

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. [name].

(response: Glory to You O Lord.)

...

The Gospel of the Lord.

(response: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.)

Silence/Reflection

Allow a short time for silence following the reading. You may give older students a reflection question pertinent to the reading to think about.

Petitions

For the Pope, the bishops and all the clergy: that they may continue to guide us in living our faith, we pray to the Lord. (response: Lord, hear our prayer.)

For all government leaders: that they may work to find fair and just solutions to the world's problems, we pray to the Lord.
